# OEC Technical / Trade School Scholarship - 2023

## **PURPOSE:**

Ohio's Electric Cooperatives (OEC) offers this scholarship to help cooperative members, and/or dependents of cooperative members, pursue Technical / Trade School certificates.

# **ADVERTISING/APPLICATIONS:**

This scholarship is advertised in *Ohio Cooperative Living* magazine every March and April. Applications and rules are available online from March 1 – April 30 of each year.

## **SCHOLARSHIPS:**

Applicants will be eligible to win up to a \$2,000 scholarship.

## **RULES AND REGULATIONS:**

The following provisions govern the eligibility of applicants for the OEC Technical / Trade School Scholarship:

- 1. Applicants may be <u>high school graduates enrolling in a Technical / Trade School program, current Technical / Trade School enrollees, and/or students enrolling in a post-undergraduate Technical / Trade School program.</u> Applicants must plan to attend and/or currently attend an <u>accredited</u> Technical / Trade School school program.
- 2. Applicants must be: permanent <u>residential</u> members of an Ohio electric distribution cooperative, and/or their dependent children/legal wards.
- 3. Ohio electric distribution cooperative employees who are permanent <u>residential</u> members of an Ohio electric distribution cooperative, and/or their dependent children/legal wards **may** also apply.
- 4. <u>Commercial</u> electric cooperative members and their dependent children/legal wards are not eligible unless they are also permanent <u>residential</u> electric cooperative members.
- 5. Applicants must have cumulative grade point averages of 2.5 or above on a 4.0 scale or the equivalent standing on nontraditional scales. High school GPAs shall be used for applicants who have not yet begun a program, while Technical / Trade School GPAs shall be used for applicants currently enrolled in programs.
- 6. Applicants who have received "full-ride" scholarships (tuition, room, board, and books) to the schools of their choice are not eligible for OEC scholarships.
- 7. Applicants who have won scholarships from OEC and/or affiliated organizations in other scholarship competitions (not including local co-ops) are not qualified to win this competition.
- 8. All scholarships must be accepted in the first academic year after proof of enrollment\* is received by OEC. However, an <u>extension of one year may be granted</u> for just cause in the judgment of the president of OEC. If applicants cannot fulfill their enrollment obligation under this program, awards are forfeited.
- 9. Application information must be confined to the official nomination form. The only attachments permitted are high school transcripts, proof of enrollment\* in a program, typed essay responses, and one 500-word letter of recommendation from an instructor.

- 10. Applicants are advised to write the two required essays as document files, then spell check, grammar check, and word count them before uploading them. Applicants shall refer to <a href="https://www.ohioec.org/TechnicalScholarship">https://www.ohioec.org/TechnicalScholarship</a> to complete the cooperative knowledge essay. The two required essays are:
  - One detailing their educational and career goals; and
  - And a second that discusses cooperative knowledge per the online orientation
  - Applicants must complete the essays without outside assistance

- 12. \*Accepted proofs of enrollment include: an official course schedule, or an official program transcript. Both must include the schools' names or urls, **and** the applicants' names.
- \*\* This link may require the applicant to create a free <u>gmail.com</u> email account. If a website blocked message appears, try reloading/refreshing the page.

#### **JUDGING:**

All qualified applicants will be judged by the following criteria: a maximum of 30 points for scholastic record (academic criteria should include GPA and quality of academic classes); a maximum of 30 points for personal achievement, school, and community activities; and a maximum of 40 points for the written essays.

Judges may give priority to fields of study deemed more relevant to electric cooperatives.
